
Toradh Gallery 2 Syd Bluett Exhibition


Type Trail 2024



Brimming with compassion and humour, Tom has secrets to share and a future to fix in this Tom Moran and Abbey Theatre co-production.





Meath Arts Office Associate Artist, Deirdre Kinahan wins inaugural Terry Pratchett Prize

Congratulations to Meath Arts Office Associate Artist, playwright **Deirdre Kinahan** who, along with Actor Bryan Murray was recently awarded The Trinity Centre for Literary and Cultural Translation inaugural Pratchett Prize for challenging the stigma of Alzheimer's Disease in her play An Old Song, Half Forgotten.

The 2023 Abbey Theatre production was written for and performed by one of Ireland's most celebrated actors,
Bryan Murray, who himself is living with Alzheimer's. The original concept development week was held at Dunderry
Park with support from the Arts Office and the Department of Tourism, Culture, Arts, Gaeltacht, Sports & Media.



Responding to the award Deirdre commented: "Writing An Old Song, Half Forgotten was one of the most thrilling, unique and humbling experiences of my 25-year theatre career to date. We wanted to celebrate the extraordinary resilience of human beings, the exquisite joy of artistic craft and the truth of Alzheimer's by creating a piece of theatre elevated rather than compromised by that condition. I hope that through this prize we can share our experience and present a blueprint for other artists, other theatres, other communities around the world - a great actor is a great actor with or without Alzheimer's".

Congratulations to Meath Arts Office Associate Artist songwriter, Oisín Leech

Oisín Leech is known as one half of The Lost Brothers - who has just released his much-acclaimed debut solo album 'Cold Sea'. Listed by the Irish Times as one of the Top Ten Albums of 2024, Leech, a Navan based musician of great sensitivity in melody and lyrics, will perform on the main stage at Another Love Story Festival in August.
