### MEATH COUNTY COUNCIL ARTS GRANTS, AWARDS & BURSARIES SCHEMES 2025

Meath County Council Arts Office is pleased to announce the launch of the 2025 Arts Grants, Awards & Bursaries Schemes which include the Annual Arts Grant, Drama League of Ireland Bursary, Festival Grant Scheme, Professional Artist Development Fund and new in 2025, the Creative Communities Award.

The Annual Arts Grant aims to support organisations, groups or individuals in the provision of local arts activities which enhance long-term development and sustainability of the arts in County Meath. Supported by Creative Ireland, the Creative Communities Award is intended to support a wide range of community groups and schools in the provision of community arts projects which promote cultural engagement and enhance long-term partnerships with professional artists. The Drama League of Ireland Bursary is intended to fund a week-long residential stay at the Drama League of Ireland Summer School at the University of Limerick. The Festival Grant Scheme is intended to support arts festivals taking place in County Meath which show a commitment to quality artistic programming and the Professional Artist Development Fund is intended to support Meath based professional arts practitioners in any field to develop their artistic practice and make or present new work.

The individual funding strands cover a wide range of disciplines, arts practices and activities and are intended to enable individuals, groups and organisations to develop and sustain their work in the arts throughout County Meath and are part of a suite of supports provided to artists in the county. These supports have been strengthened in 2025 with additional funding from the Arts Council of Ireland and Creative Ireland.

Calling all writers! Are you looking for feedback on your writing? We are delighted to be sponsoring a writer from County Meath to take part in this year's Irish Writers Centre National Mentoring Programme.

The National Mentoring Programme is an exciting opportunity to receive sustained creative and professional mentoring from an established Irish writer of your choosing.

#### The opportunity is available to writers of:

- Fiction
- Creative non-fiction
- Children's / Young Adult fiction
- Poetry

Each mentorship consists of three meetings with an experienced writer over a period of approximately 6–8 months. The mentor reads up to 10,000 words / 180 lines of poetry in advance and will give creative feedback at each meeting. They may also provide professional information and advice. All mentees will avail of the relationship for free.


## 'Tempest' (Fifty Nights in a Dublin Hotel) an exhibition of work by Steve Wickham

The accomplished violinist Steve Wickham has performed around the world and recorded on over 100 albums with various artists including The Waterboys, U2, Bob Dylan, REM, Sinead O' Connor and many more. Although fundamentally a musician, Wickham's practice is eclectic and includes disciplines of music, film, animation, painting, drawing and printmaking. Like the different voices in a choir, he feels the need for these broad range of disciplines to articulate ideas.

**Tempest (Fifty Nights in a Dublin Hotel)** is a solo exhibition of Steve Wickham's paintings. Describing them as 'small landscapes of the heart', and featuring excerpts from his Dublin diary written on the walls of the Toradh Gallery, the exhibition was inspired by Wickham's extended stay in Dublin during rehearsals for and performances in Deirdre Kinahan's play *Tempesta*, a return to the city where he was born after 30 years of living in the west of Ireland.

Juxtaposing vibrant illustrations with powerful writing, this exhibition features the combined work of Belfast poet **Jim McElroy**, and Kells born, Berlin based illustrator **Ann Kiernan**. The 8 mixed-media works, which were commissioned by Meath Arts Office, compliment McElroy's earthy text with defined strokes and vivid angles.

Ann Kiernan has received multiple awards for her editorial illustrations. In 2022 along with the RTE Investigates team she won the Social Justice Award for her work on Domestic Abuse: A Year in Crisis. Her clients include The Washington Post; Politico Europe & Trinity College. Multi-award winning poet Jim McElroy grew up in Co. Down. Winner of the MCC Cultural Services Francis Ledwidge Poetry Award 2020 his peom 'Hoor' became the lead poem in his chapbook 'We Are The Weather', which won the International Book and Pamphlet Award 2021 with Poetry Business.


